Bromley Beacon Academy is a special school for students with a range of Social, Emotional and Mental Health difficulties, now known as Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) difficulties.

Admission to Bromley Beacon Academy is for male and female students aged between 7 - 18 with an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP). Before admission, all students will have been assessed by an Educational Psychologist who has recommended a provision such as Bromley Beacon Academy as an appropriate placement.

Bromley Beacon Academy is located at two sites:

Key Stage Two and Three provision – Avalon Road, Orpington

Key Stage Four and Five provision – Old Homesdale Road, Bromley

Admissions are usually in September, although in-year admissions may also be made in conjunction with advice from the Local Authority.

Bromley Beacon Academy has capacity for up to one hundred and twenty students. Usually, these will be resident in the London Borough of Bromley.

Admission to Bromley Beacon Academy is through the Bromley SEN Panel. Parents or carers wishing to place a student at Bromley Beacon Academy should contact the SEN Admissions section of London Borough of Bromley.



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
